PRESIDENT'S REPORT

(Presented at the January 2024 Annual Meeting.)

2023 was an outstanding year for the Southold Historical Museum. This was due to a committed and cooperative board, a significant number of wonderful volunteers, and the excellent leadership of our Director, Deanna Witte-Walker.

Deanna will tell you about several key and effective activities of 2023.

I would like to focus on the leadership provided by our Board of Trustees and the key priorities we have established for 2024 and beyond.

First I am pleased to tell you that we will have a board with 15 outstanding members. This is not a board that meets once a month and leaves the work to others. Every single board member is also an active leader or member of one or more museum committees that are working to make the museum programs successful.

We all proudly wear pins stating "Southold Historical Museum Volunteer" and we mean it.

The board is creative, cooperative, and seriously working to recognize and meet the challenges that face our museum in this rapidly changing world. We are convinced that short-term plans are not adequate for the task. We must establish well prepared long-term planning.

Specifically, with the recommendation of the Strategic Planning Committee, the board has established Four Museum Priorities for the next 5 years. They are:

- 1. Expanded educational opportunities
- 2. Increased and improved use of technology.
- 3. Greater utilization of buildings & grounds—Prince Building, Maple Lane Complex, and Horton Point Lighthouse.
- 4. Focus on diversity of age, ethnic background, race, etc.

We hope you will join us in turning these goals into action in the year(s) ahead. While we presently have a wonderful group of 150 volunteers, we need even more volunteers to have our museum doors open more often for public use.

The Board has also changed its meeting time to 7:00 pm for the years ahead so that we can draw in new members who are younger and working full-time.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

Buildings and grounds is an essential part of how we "do business." The historic buildings of Southold Historical Museum help us to fulfill our mission. The various buildings of the Maple Lane Complex as well as the Prince Building, help to share our Southold story. Preserving them is a critical task. Additionally, buildings like the Collections Center allow us to follow museum standards and best practices.

The below list represents just a few specific tasks that were accomplished in 2023.

Replacement of cedar siding on south façade of the Thomas Moore house. A legislative grant through Suffolk County helped fund the supplies needed.

Painting of the upstairs restroom at the Prince Building.

Repair of ceiling and painting in the Krukowski House kitchen.

New walkway in front of Prince Building/Treasure Exchange shop.

Painting inside the Horton Point Lighthouse (we maintain the museum space, but do not own the building itself.)

Of course, there are additional regular maintenance items such as plumbing, exterminating, electrical work, tree trimming, etc.

EDUCATION OF YOUTH

Our main events this past year were Stepback in History week in May for students at Southold Elementary School grades K-6. We are continuing to reach out to community members for volunteers to help with those programs. Our other main event this year was the Candlelight Tour, making ornaments in the schoolhouse.

We had 4 committee breakfast meetings this year. We have firmed up the dates for Stepback 2024. Our week will begin April 30th. Orders for materials have been placed, we've reached out to New Suffolk School and will organize pre visit materials in the early spring.

EXHIBITS

The Committee met monthly to discuss projects covering the next five years.

The committee is decorating one window of the Prince Building office to focus on current themes during the year.

HORTON POINT LIGHTHOUSE

In 2023, we had almost 2,000 visitors, took in \$5,500 in admissions, and sold \$2,500 dollars-worth of gift shop items. A lot of this interest is because of Mary Korpi and her book about Stella, our lady lighthouse keeper.

Thanks to a donation from a Southold Historical Museum patron, we were able to buy shirts for our volunteers which include the term "Lighthouse Keeper".

We ended the season with the traditional Chilly Chili Party, held on the Lighthouse porch. The party was well attended by our volunteers and everyone seemed to enjoy it.

Ray and Jill recently met with Deanna to discuss some of the issues for next season, including maintenance needs, changes to museum displays, possible themes for the rotating exhibit in the Baymen's room, the lecture series on the Lighthouse lawn and the possibility of opening the Lighthouse as part of Southold's WinterFest.
